About Working in Waterloo Wellington Dufferin Health Care

What is the Human Resource Health Care Committee of Waterloo Wellington Dufferin?

A local committee that provides its members with a forum for discussing and strengthening local health care human resources.

The primary areas of discussion revolve around human resources challenges and opportunities, marketing of Waterloo and Wellington as a health care employment destination and coordinating recruitment and training needs within the sector.

This committee is supported by the Workforce Planning Board Waterloo Wellington who has been engaged in research and industry consultations with the local health care sector.

How can the committee help me find a health care job?

The committee, through its working groups and as a whole, is looking at ways to encourage employers to share their HR needs. This may be through research, coming together to put out information or making connections at local career and job events with students and jobseekers. The committee seeks to inform people about the skills and careers that are in-demand in the sector.

The committee is also encouraging local employers to utilize central job boards like the one found on WW HealthLine and HealthForceOntario Job Portal to promote their vacancies. A one-stop shop for health care careers will allow candidates, like you, the opportunity to explore many opportunities at once and, where possible, to look at combining positions to meet your needs.

Direct support in finding a job can be done through your school or the local Employment Ontario agencies that have connections with the committee.

About Health Care Careers

- Not every career is in demand in every health care setting. The different areas of health care have unique health care human resources needs.
- Many health care employers offer co-op placements for high school students and take placements from postsecondary educators.
- In some health care environments, new hires begin as casual or part-time employees. Some employers give employees the opportunity to pick-up shifts beyond scheduled hours.
- Computer skills are becoming a larger part of the day-to-day work for health care employees.
- Waterloo Wellington Dufferin offers urban employment opportunities which can mean specialized and niche skills are in demand. The area also offers rural employment opportunities which may mean being a "jack of many trades" in a health care setting. There is a career waiting here to meet your needs.
